

FTP User Guide:

What is FTP?

FTP (File Transfer Protocol) is a means of transferring files over an Internet connection. Windows (from the command prompt) includes software to complete this, although many third-party software vendors make easier to use, more feature filled solutions. You can find third-party FTP clients available to download for free on the Internet. EOT also includes a "web ftp" solution, which does not require software to be installed on your PC.

WebFTP:

You access WebFTP via <http://webftp.eotnet.net> Enter your email address and password to login. From this interface you can upload files, create directories (folders), and manipulate files (delete or rename them)

Personal Web Space:

Personal web space allows you to have a website, or file storage location, without having to register a domain name (mysite.com) Files uploaded to your web space are available for viewing by visiting the following address: www.eotnet.net/~your_username The file placed in the "public_html" folder named index.htm or index.html will be displayed upon browsing to this address. If no file is named or located in the "public_html" folder a simple file structure map will be displayed.

FTP Clients:

If you use a third-party FTP client to upload or transfer files to your web space, here are some basic settings that will help you configure this client to connect to your web space.

Host (or address you want to connect to): **ftp.eotnet.net**

Username: username of your main email account (the part of the address before the @ symbol)

Password: password for the above email account

Most other settings like port, transfer mode etc. can usually be left to their default values. Try using the client's "quick connect" feature.
